he regional round of "TCS IT WiZ 2014', an interschool quiz contest, took place in the City recently. Around 11,000 students took part in the quiz organised by Tata Consultancy Service and six teams qualified for the final round. The prizes were distributed by cricketer L K Rahul and Nagraj Ijar, VP and head of TCS Bangalore.
