IIT to host Delhi leg of TCS IT Wiz

The Delhi edition of Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) IT Wiz, 2014, the biggest inter-school IT quiz programme in the country, will kick off on Saturday at the Indian Institute of Technology-Delhi. The quiz, which is open to students from Class 8-12, is being held across 14 locations in India — Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Bhubaneswar, Chennai, Coimbatore, Hyderabad, Indore, Kochi, Kolkata, Lucknow, Mumbai, Nagpur and Pune. Each school can send 10 teams of two members each. The quiz will also be held on Twitter — TCS tweetwiz — for all participants, where three questions will appear on screen and students will tweet their answers on a given twitter handle. The quiz will focus on the applications of information technology, trends, legends and other emerging areas.
