2 city schools among best in country

INDORE: Two schools from Indore - The Daly College (DC) and The Emerald Heights International School - have made it to the top 10 schools of the country in the India School ranking 2015 survey conducted among 11,660 respondents across 27 cities by Education World (EW), a Bangalurubased education magazine. However, the criteria on which the schools were judged has not yet been disclosed. While DC clinched the top spot in the Day-cum-Boarding school category, The Emerald Heights International came in seventh. A telephonic survey of educationists, parents and senior students (included for the first time in the survey) was conducted by Delhi-based market research and opinion company Centre for Forecasting (C-Fore) on behalf of EW. Apart from the two schools in the city, The Scindia School, Gwalior (fourth best in Boys Boarding School category) and Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya (second best in Girls Boarding School category) are the only other schools from the state that were featured in the list.
